# President's Report

## Not Or, And !

At the Club's Annual Dinner, I talked about two very powerful words – OR versus AND. OR is divisive and inhibits collaboration; AND promotes creativity and harmony. A few years ago, there were some OR attitudes in our Club – particularly, lifesaving versus surf sports. The Board has worked hard for four years to turn that OR culture around to AND. As the young girl in the Mexican food commercial says “*Por que no los dos ?*” - Why not do both ?

Lifesaving has always been the Club's reason for being, and we would never hold back on anything needed to provide outstanding lifesaving services on our beach. But, we certainly have the financial strength to do both. Let's talk about the Club's financials over the last six years, from 2010.

Club annual revenue has steadily increased from \$150,000 per year to almost \$400,000 (with minimal increase in member fees!). As well as a capital efficiency initiative to lease our Club 4WD rather than purchase a new one, a large proportion of the increase has been due to the outstanding efforts of our Marketing team, increasing the amount of external sponsorship and donation money coming into the Club from \$50,000 per year to well over \$100,000 per year.

No doubt, we are spending more and, in particular, for the operation and maintenance of our fabulous Clubrooms. But we have spent conservatively, never more than we brought in, until this year. We built a cash reserve reaching \$350,000 last year, and this allowed us to spend around \$100,000 over the last three years to completely upgrade our competition equipment. A few years ago, we were expecting our competitors to get out there on twenty year old West Coast boards – now, they're winning on new blue and gold Dolphins boards, and Fenn and Interceptor skis !

Now, match that with the Club's philosophy about promoting Junior participation in surf sports. Of our nearly 300 Juniors in the U10 to U13 age groups, over half participate in surf sports – if some don't wish to compete in solo events, they really enjoy forming and competing as teams. And the results are there to see. In four years, our Juniors have moved from 8th on the State Championship leader table to coming second last year, and winning the Junior State Championship Handicap Shield! Our Masters, where numbers have jumped from six to thirty-six over the same period, have moved from 8th to 4th this year. And our Seniors, whose ranks were depleted by members moving to other clubs, have maintained their position at 6th, due mainly to the inclusion now of our U14's who performed exceptionally well.

It's incredibly gratifying to see all the hard work by many starting to pay off !

## Leadership Development

Another key metric has been our membership growth over

the same period. We have seen our Junior membership grow at between 5 to 8 percent per year. This year, we might have dropped from being the largest, to third largest, Juniors club in WA, but our numbers are still very strong. A consequence of our success is that we now have large numbers of under 14's coming onto patrol with their SRC qualification. Anecdotal evidence is that other clubs are seeing their numbers decline and that patrollers are primarily 'grey hairs'. Since 2010, our patrol numbers have swelled from 250 to 370 now.

While this is very positive, it has given the Board cause for consideration – how many young members we have now on patrol, how to manage these large numbers and how to give them the skills to be able to handle a stressful incident, should it arise. As a result, leadership development is now a major focus area for the Club. Our Club has always been a strong supporter of the SLSA and SLSWA leadership programs. However, in addition, we have mapped out a framework of leadership behaviours, across age groups from U14's through to Directors on the Board and we are now building resources to be able to take leadership training to our members. Part of this has already been put in place in our Youth organisation – development pathways to allow our kids to take on roles with more responsibility, such as Trainee Age Group Managers, Trainee coaches, Camp leaders etc. There is a wonderful article on Leadership Development at Fremantle later in this Report.

## SLSWA Awards of Excellence

Backing up from our terrific results in last year's awards (where we were nominated in five and won three awards), this year, Fremantle was nominated in three categories at the 2017 SLSWA Awards of Excellence. Ethan Stewart was again nominated for the Support Operations Volunteer of the Year (after winning it last year). And our club was nominated for both the Patrol Club of the Year (which we won last year!), and Lavan Club of the Year awards !

While we were unsuccessful this year in the Support Operations and Patrol Club awards, we were very proud to have been the third best Club in WA this year, and bring home a \$2000 cheque as reward for our hard work.

### Club Person of the Year award

This year, the award was presented to Matt Elliott, a very popular choice ! Matt is one of our Patrol Captains, as well as one of our jet ski drivers. When he's not doing shark patrols, he spends many mornings each week coaching our younger members in the finer arts of board paddling – and then shows the same silky skills as one of our Masters competitors. He is also the Club's Marketing Manager and majorly responsible for that incredible amount of sponsorship and donation money.

And, he makes a mean lasagne and Mojito.


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# Director of Finance Report

I am pleased to present the Financial Report for year ended 30 April 2017.

## OPERATING RESULT

The Club has recorded a net loss of \$17,897 for the financial year ended 30 April 2017 after amortisation, depreciation and accounting adjustments, but before capital expenditures and provisioning to reserves.

The result for the Club for the year ended 30 April 2017, prior to accounting adjustments, amounted to a surplus of \$18,224.

Our major sources of Income were:

• Membership	\$155,843
• Premises Hire	\$ 10,419
• Fund Raising	\$ 7,156
• Sponsorship	\$ 64,827
• Donations	\$ 19,038
• Canteen	\$ 9,235

The major areas of Expenditure were:

• Administration	\$117,416
• Building Services	\$ 64,800 (net of sublease recoups)
• Comp Equipment	\$ 23,631 (repairs and maintenance)
• Lifesaving	\$ 12,892
• Competition	\$ 13,799
• Juniors	\$ 15,241

New capital expenditure during 2016-17 has more than doubled over previous seasons and amounted to \$86,762. The club was lucky enough to have received direct sponsorship (\$27,000 received last year) for the Surf Boat.

Equipment acquisitions included:

- 3 Double surf skis
- Surf Boat and trailer;

- 7 Senior racing Malibu boards;
- IRB Motor and 2 IRB Hulls;
- 4 Junior glass racing boards;
- Development Skis (Youth);
- 5 Soft BRT nipper boards

## BALANCE SHEET

As at 30 April 2017, the Club's net assets were valued at \$1,934,250.

The Club's cash assets amounted to \$252,858 at the end of the financial year.

## LOOKING FORWARD

The Club has been operating for the past two to three seasons on a program of building reserves and had deferred substantive expenditure on the replacement of water craft and related equipment. During the 2016-17 season the club took a conscious decision to increase its capital spend and more than doubled the amount of previous years, despite this spend and the reduced level of revenue we still had a comfortable level of reserves at 30 April.

This outcome affirms our approach, however as membership remains our primary source of income and sponsorship and other additional revenue is not guaranteed we need to continue to work cautiously to provide a sound base for future members.

The club has put a new structure in place during the past year and this together with the retirement of our long standing administrator offers an opportunity for a review administrative process by the incoming Board. I believe two areas we should focus on include procedures for asset control and stocktake process and frequency; and banking policy and administrative controls with new personal and internal structures.

In conclusion I would like to acknowledge the hard work of all Board and Committee members and particularly our administration staff for their efforts throughout the year.

# Independent Audit Report to the Members of Fremantle Surf Life Saving Club Inc

I have audited the accompanying Special Purpose Financial Report of the Fremantle Surf Life Saving Club Inc, which comprises the Statement of Financial Position as at 30 April 2017, the Statement of Income and Expenditure for the year ended 30 April 2017, and the notes comprising a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

## *The Board's responsibility for the special purpose financial report*

The Board Fremantle Surf Life Saving Club Inc (the "Board") is responsible for the financial report that gives a true and fair view in accordance with the accounting policies described in Note 1 to the financial statements and the Associations Incorporation Act (WA) 2015. The Board's responsibility also includes such internal control as the Board determine is necessary to enable the preparation and fair presentation of a financial report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

## *Auditor's Responsibility*

My responsibility is to express an opinion on the financial report based on my audit. I conducted the audit in accordance with the Australian Auditing Standards. Those standards require that I comply with relevant ethical requirements relating to audit engagements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial report is free from material misstatement.

The financial report has been prepared for the purpose of fulfilling the requirements of the Associations Incorporations Act 2015. I disclaim any assumption of responsibility for any reliance on this report or on the financial report to which it relates to any person other than the members, or for any purpose other than that for which it was prepared.

The audit has been conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. My procedures included examination, on test basis, of evidence supporting the amount and other disclosures in the financial report and the evaluation of significant accounting estimates. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion whether in all material respects, the financial report is presented fairly in accordance with the accounting policies described in Note 1 so as to present a view which is consistent with my understanding of the Club's financial position, and performance as represented by the results of its operations.

The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.

## *Independence*

In conducting my audit, I have complied with the independence requirements of the Australian professional accounting bodies.

## *Opinion*

In my opinion, the financial report represents fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Fremantle Surf Life Saving Club Inc as at 30 April 2017 and the results of its operations for the year ended in accordance with the accounting policies described in Note 1 to the financial statements.

## *Emphasis of a Matter*

Without qualification of the opinion expressed above, attention is drawn to the following matters:

- i) As is common for organisations of this type, it is not practical for Fremantle Surf Life Club Inc to maintain an effective system of internal controls over donations, subscriptions and other fundraising activities until their initial entry into the accounting records. Accordingly, the audit in relation to fundraising and cash receipts was limited to testing amounts recorded in the book.
- ii) The going concern of Fremantle Surf Life Saving Club is dependent on the ability of the club to fund raise and generate adequate resources to meet the expenditure.

Unfortunately Cyclone Debbie caused the cancellation of most of the Aussie Championship events.

Overall, between sponsorship and fundraising, we have achieved over \$90,000 this season. The money we raised over the year went to many areas of the surf club. We were able to purchase six new Dolphin boards, on one of which our team won an Australian Gold medal. We also bought

up-and-coming Youth leaders, Claire Ryan read the Surf Lifesavers prayer.



# Lifesaving & Education Report

This year saw a change to the way the Education and Life Saving areas were managed, with the introduction of a Director of Life Saving and Education and a Manager of Life Saving –Caitlyn Rothnie, and a Manager of Education- John Price. These guys have been fantastic and the process a great success because of their enthusiasm and constant effort.

Fremantle Surf Life Saving club has provided 310 patrolling surf lifesaving members over the 6 month period from end of September 2016 to beginning April 2017, covering 3km of beach including Port Beach, Leighton Beach and Mosman Beach. This resulted in more than 7,400 patrol hours plus an additional 1,600 hours for water safety to cover our Sunday nipper program. We performed 6 rescues, 61 First Aid treatments and over 240 preventive actions.

In addition to rostered patrols and nipper water safety, we provided water safety and life saving support to events like the Port to Pub swim, Mirvac Leighton Swim Thru , Open water swimming events and others. We are also experiencing an increase in requests from other organisations to provide water safety for their activities, which is creating opportunities for our Bronze holders to expand their skills while earning some money. Look out for these opportunities in the coming season as advertised on Team App.

To enable this to happen, existing members had to be re-qualified with most of them being respectful of the need to have a reduced number of such days to prevent assessor burnout. We also train new people to enhance their existing skills and to ensure that new members are available to patrol the beaches

# The Mirvac Latitude at Leighton

## 36th Leighton Swim Thru Report by Colin Duffield



Perfect swimming conditions greeted 93 swimmers (vs 203 in 2016) for the 36th Annual Swim Thru Leighton at Leighton Beach on Saturday February 11th. The outlook leading up the Swim day was not promising with strong winds and rough seas threatening to cause difficult conditions. However, slight winds from the east flattened the water, along with the absence of stingers which made for very comfortable conditions for the swimmers.

This year's event was again sponsored by Mirvac Latitude at Leighton with naming rights and was also generously supported by our many long term partners.

The hooter sounded at 8.00 am sharp and the first wave of 3200m swimmers took off under clear skies with plenty of sunshine at 24 deg C and hardly a ripple on the water.

The swim is one of many run as part of the SLSWA Open Water Swim Series. This season for the sixth time we ran a 3200 metre event along with the traditional 1600 metre events and this proved very popular with 60 swimmers (vs 69 in 2016) opting for the longer distance and the 1600m attracted 33 (vs 134 in 2016) entrants.

The presentations were delayed slightly due to a printer mishap at the timing station - however, after the last swimmer crossed the line, results were provided by BlueChip which also enabled us to give a detailed commentary with competitor's names as they came under the finishing arch.

The first female to complete the traditional 1600 metre course for the second year was Heidi Gan in 21:44. The first male was Simon Huitenga in a time of 20:56. The closest to their nominated time was Greg Underwood who swam 32:59 - which was 31 second faster than his nominated time.

Paul Blackbeard, was the first male to complete the longer distance of 3200 metres in 44:21, hard on his heels as first female Jaime Bowler in 44:52 for the second year running. The closest to their nominated time was Allison Hass who swam 2:21 faster than her nominated time.

Fremantle Surf Club was represented by around a dozen clubbies swimming the various distances. However it would be great to get more of our own members competing in an event on their own beach.

Without the tireless efforts and support of many of our Club members who took on extra duties, an event like this cannot be run. I would especially like to thank Pip Hawson, John Summers, Larry Tilbury and Carol Duffield for their hard work in the lead up and on the actual event day. Our hard working office staff Jo and Terry are to be commended for their big efforts.

Matt Elliott as Marketing Director supported the event with signing Mirvac again as the naming rights sponsor for the third year and gave Mirvac the profile they were looking for to promote their new development "Latitude at Leighton".

We must also thank our local businesses who donated prizes: Esplanade Hotel Fremantle, Golden Egg Farms, SLSWA, and Coast at Port Beach, Bib & Tucker and Aussie Natural Spring Water.

Unfortunately this year the event did not realise the financial outcome as previous years due to lack of cash donations by sponsors and very low participant numbers. This might be attributed to any number of reasons, including weather forecasting lightning and storms on the day, competition with more open water and other multi sports events, direct conflict with the Busselton Jetty Swim and a lack of promotion of our event.

Some opinions canvassed recently suggest a couple of options to rejuvenate the Swim profile and numbers are to review the date of the Swim to avoid clashes, have a debriefing and review soon after the event (April), and to nominate a dedicated committee to manage the Swim and present a three year Strategic Plan for the Swim, defining expected outcomes and processes.

Other options to alter the format could include adding other events alongside, having greater involvement of the City of Fremantle, contracting out some events to a promoter, and beginning the advertising of the event earlier and across more media platforms.

As a first step to rejuvenate the Swim Thru, the date has already been changed on SLSWA's calendar to 17th February 2018 to avoid the clash with the Busselton Jetty Swim, and puts it a full week prior to the Rottnest Channel Swim. City of Fremantle has been notified of the date and the involvement of more events.

A new committee will be formed to prepare the plans for the event.

# Leadership Development at Fremantle

As a Board, we decided that leadership development was going to be a key focus area of the 2016-17 season and beyond. We train our members well in the technical aspects of life saving and first aid, but we can do so much more across all age groups in developing leadership skills such as good communication, listening, resilience, self-motivation and team working, to enable our members to handle difficult incident situations as well. Leadership as a whole club process is fundamental to the longevity and strategic direction of our club.

This year, as a part of creating a framework of leadership behaviours that we believe are important, we developed a Leadership Development Scope for Youth with the intent of providing a pathway for youth to become active senior life savers by developing their capabilities in the areas of teamwork, leadership, fitness, surf skills and lifesaving skills. These pathways parallel the award and opportunity pathways provided through SLSA and include innovative ideas for younger members such as trainee Age Group Manager, trainee SRC trainer, junior Patrol Captain, or nipper camp leaders.

As part of the whole club leadership programme, Fremantle SLSC was represented with participants at the Surf Life Saving Western Australia's state leadership camps TOAD and Rise Up, as well as Surf Life Saving Australia's National Leadership College. Our club has been a strong supporter of the NLC, having sent 16 members over the last ten years. Further to this, two club members assisted as mentors on the SLSWA's TOAD camp. As a club, we are proud of the high calibre of young leaders we have and, as a Board, we are excited for the skills and knowledge they return to club with. The following are reflections from participants in these camps.

## ***TOAD Camp was the best!! (by Carly Pizzuto)***

On Monday 16th January 2017, I was so excited to be going to Rottnest for TOAD Camp, and even better as I had never been to Rottnest. I didn't know what to expect but I knew it was going to be lots of fun, we were going to learn loads of different things and meet lots of new people who all love being part of Surf Life Saving. When we arrived at the ferry terminal we loaded our bags, got our names ticked off, were given our t-shirts and cap, boarded the ferry and we were off.

#### ***Rise Up (by Eamon Wilkinson)***

Last year I was selected along with Patrick Smith and Jessica Leng to go to Rise Up. Rise Up is a camp run by SLSWA to encourage young surf life savers to strive for leadership rolls. On the camp we participated in a variety of activities which had us work in a team and hear out everyone's ideas and work successfully. We also had to prepare the meal area as well as wash the dishes which each team would do at least once. Through this experience I have learnt much and forged many friendships with members of other clubs. I would recommend the camp to anyone who wishes to further their experience in surf lifesaving.

#### ***National Leadership College (by Liam Burke, Jack Palmer and Sarah Green)***

In February this year we were fortunate enough to attend the Surf Life Saving Australia National Leadership College (NLC), which took place at St Paul's College, Sydney University. The 7 day program brought together 23 like-minded young lifesavers from around Australia to advance our leadership skills and assist in personal development.

Each day focused on a different aspect of leadership like intra-personal, inter-personal and inclusive leadership, which we explored through facilitation groups, activities and guest speakers. 
## STATE CHAMPIONS







My Surf Sports committee members have done a fantastic job in summarizing activity in their areas, so I will avoid


repeating their reports. However, I will describe some of the highlights of this season for me.



# Fremantle Beach Relay team 1981-82 to 1991-92 recognized in the SLSWA Sporting Hall of Fame

**T**his year marks thirty years since Fremantle SLSC won the 1987 Australian Open Beach Relay Championship at Scarborough Beach. This was an exceptional achievement at the very highest level of Surf Sports competition. But perhaps as remarkable was the Fremantle team's extended success in Western Australian beach sprinting and beach relay for over a decade.

With a combination of a well-structured training program, good coaching, discipline, organisation, leadership and goal focus as well as camaraderie and fun at training, the team built a running squad that dominated Western Australian beach sprints and beach relay from 1981-82 to 1991-92.

In the WA Open Beach Relay Championship, the Fremantle "A" Team achieved 10 firsts and 1 second in 11 years. After defeating the champion City of Perth team for the first time in a classic 1982 State final, a baton drop relegated the team to second place behind Trigg Island in 1983. From there, it won nine consecutive WA Open Beach Relay Championships, as well as the 1987 Australian Championship and a second placing at the 1988 World Championships.

Winning Fremantle Relay team members included at various times the 1987 Australian Champion team of Mark Nolan (9 wins), Mark Peters (6 wins), Richard Hickson (5 wins) and Rod Pavlovich (5 wins). Other runners were Brian Troy (4 wins), Jeff Davidson (4 wins), Philip Hopkins (2 wins), Paul Nolan (2 wins), and one win each for Aaron Brinkworth, Adam Mills and Scott Dennon.


Fremantle's record of nine consecutive WA Open Beach Relay Titles equals the consecutive record of SLSWA Hall of Fame Members North Cottesloe Beach Relay Team 1948-49 to 1956-57.

In the WA Open Beach Sprint Championships, after Brian Troy's near-miss second-place in 1982, Fremantle runners won 10 consecutive titles from 1983 to 1992. These Championships were won by individual Hall of Fame members Mark Nolan (4 wins) and Jeff Davidson (2 wins), Richard Hickson (2 wins), Mark Peters (1 win plus a further win in 1994) and Philip Hopkins, who won the first title in 1983.

Seven of the runners (Adam Mills, Brian Troy, Jeff Davidson, Mark Nolan, Mark Peters, Philip Hopkins and Richard Hickson) also represented Western Australia with distinction in State Team competitions during this period, with Richard Hickson serving as State Vice-Captain in 1988. In addition, Fremantle Beach Coach and triple Australian Beach Flag Champion Robert Pickard was State Vice-Captain in 1982, State Captain in 1984 and State Coach in 1984-85.

With its State Title record in Beach Sprint and Beach Relay, combined with its 1987 Australian Beach Relay Championship, the Fremantle Beach Team 1981-82 to 1991-92 is probably the most successful beach team in WA surf lifesaving history.

For a dominant and sustained performance over a decade, the Fremantle Beach Relay Team 1981-82 to 1991-92 was a worthy candidate for recognition in the SLSWA Hall of Fame. The team was inducted on March 4th, 2017, and presented at the SLSWA 2017 Awards of Excellence.


# Beach Report



The weekly club swim was quite challenging at times due to weather conditions and sometimes just because I felt



It is the same group of people who are called on for rescues, who supply members to the Emergency Response Team, and who provide water safety for carnivals.

I am proud of the sportsmanship and high skill level demonstrated by all IRB members throughout the year, and for their ongoing commitment to patrols and water safety together with a real and genuine desire to see Fremantle as one club. I have seen each member show the dedication, true grit and determination befitting a surf life saver.

# Juniors Surf Sports Report

**M**ain objectives for Junior Surf Sports this year were to -

- Create an online booking system;
- Minimise and simplify communication channels;
- Involve the younger age groups in the club championship activities.

I am pleased when I look back in a season of high activity that we mostly achieved what we set out to do.

R&R and Pool Rescue kicked off the points season proper for Fremantle Nippers, which was grandly coordinated by Caitlyn Rothnie. Caitlyn has built the image and importance of these events over the last 3 years for Fremantle to be a prominent club.

## R&R (Caitlyn Rothnie)

Fremantle had 14 junior members who competed at the SLSWA Lifesaving State Championships (February 2017) in the 2 Person Rescue & Resuscitation (R&R) event. This year the competition was strong. Of our 14 competitors, 8 were aged up, so competing against older nippers. All 14 nippers can hold their heads high with greatly improved individual performances. They have also learnt valuable skills that will assist them in future learning of rescue and resuscitation techniques. It is certainly a positive starting point for next season. The most notable performance was from U13's Sophia Covella and Isabella Mentz who just missed out on a place in the finals by a mere 2 points. A big thank you goes to all the participating nippers and their parents for their dedication, hard work and positive attitudes throughout the season. It has been rewarding for the coaches to see the growth in these important life skills of all those involved.

## Pool Rescue (Caitlyn Rothnie)

Fremantle juniors showed off their strong skills at the WA Pool Rescue State Championships in July 2016 by coming in second place (with 262 points)! Every nipper, 28 in total, that attended the championships contributed to the overall points awarded for our club (top 6 positions), which is very exciting. These results are encouraging to maintain our high participation goals for nipper competition across surf

sports at Fremantle.

This time there was involvement from the U8's and U9's getting them primed for years to come. Jay even pushed the U6's and U7's into the long distance run.

The 1600m swim challenged the nippers and 45 kids stood up and managed the event, on one of the best days of the year.

We were blessed with Brad Ness and his inspirational speech who had the kids contained for the longest concentration span ever seen with Nippers at the players tea.

Beach and board training was again provided by Jack Dowie/Kelly Aitken-Fox and Martin Jackson/Matt Elliott respectively, for which we saw some very good numbers. The coaches' commitment to the development of our Nippers should not go unmentioned, turning up every Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday mornings to provide training. Much appreciated! Increasing numbers at those training sessions and providing more at Trigg beach shall be the next objective of 2017-18 season.

The club has built up the image of Nipper surf sports over the past five years by providing suitable equipment to compete with, and many training avenues to better skills. I know the finalised position on the Nipper overall points ranking does not happen overnight, nor in one season, and to those that laid the path before us (Cath Morgan, Bruce Mentz and others), we owe a large debt of gratitude.

In the Overall points ranking in 2016-17 season (which includes R&R and Pool Rescue events), we finished with a massive 532 points, 300 above the next placed club and just 127 behind Trigg in first place. However, we finished first in the club handicap which is derived based on handicap from the previous three years overall points score! Fremantle last won this in 2007.
