ANNUAL REPORT.

In presenting this, the Eleventh Annual Report I am happy to say that at the close of the season the Club was again back to normal strength as compared with the five previous years. This year has also been rather free of vandalism to Club premises etc. It is pleasing to know that club will soon be better housed and that the North Fremantle Councel are going to make improvements on the beach.

MEMBERSHIP.

At the close of last season, the Club had only 41 members including Senior-Junior-Sub-Junior & Associate. This year we have jumped to a total of 75 inclusive of all grades. I sincerely hope that next year we shall top the hundred mark. This I think shall be accomplished as I am happy to say that we shall have a more up to date Club Room to accommodate our members, this has come about by the great efforts of our Womens Auxilliary who raised just over £300 and after a deputation to the North Fremantle Councel they decided to aid us on a pound for pound basis. The building has already been purchased and tenders have closed in regard to the dismantling cartage and re-erection on the beach. I am hoping that this will be done before the opening of the 1946-47 season.

PATROLS.

As in last years report there is little to say except that our patrols were much stronger and therfore the work was spread over more members. Inter Patrol competition was keen and the trophy was won by Gold Patrol captained by D.Pass.

RESCUES.

During the 45-46 season the rescues were heavier than the previous years, the rescues consisting of 3 with boat, 10 with line and 6 without line, of all these cases none needed resuscitation.

AMBULENCE ROOM.

The number of casualities at the Clubs ambulence room were in comparison to last year a little lighter. These totalled 66 of which 2 were conveyed to hospital. While on the subject of the Ambulence Room I wish to state that when the new Club Rooms are erected this essential part of the Clubs work will be transferred from its present position to the new building.

INTERCLUB COMPETITION.

The Club this year entered ah Interclub Carnivals and we showed a marked improvement on previous years. At our own Carnival we won on the day so therefore regained the North Fremantle Shield. Our Junior, L. Cottman, brought the champion beltman both Junior and Senior to this Club and D. Gow brought us the champion sprint. In the S.L.S.A. Presidents Efficiency Trophy we were fourth, dropping back one place on last year.

The front will be taken up with the ambulence room and an office on the left hand si de and the change room on the right hand side with a brick shower recess built on the outside. The remainder of the building will be for recreation, meetings and training during the winter months. This will of course be a great asset to the Club and should induce new members to join our ranks.
